### **LDF Applauds President Biden’s Signing of Respect for Marriage Act**

Today, President Biden signed the Respect for Marriage Act into law after bipartisan votes in the United States House of Representatives and United States Senate advanced the bill to his desk on December 8.

In response to the Act becoming law, [Legal Defense Fund](#) (LDF) Director of Policy and Director of LDF’s Washington, D.C. Office Lisa Cylar Barrett issued the following statement:

“LDF applauds President Biden and the bipartisan members of Congress who advanced this critical protection for LGBTQ+ and interracial couples – one that repeals the Defense of Marriage Act by providing clear statutory authority for same-sex and interracial marriages and by requiring states to recognize valid marriages conducted in other states.

“In support of interracial marriage in the lead-up to the landmark *Loving v. Virginia* ruling and again in support of marriage equality prior to the historic decision in *Obergefell v. Hodges*, LDF has repeatedly noted that no one deserves to be discriminated against because of who they are or how they identify.

“Anything less than full equality for couples is the equivalent of relegating LGBTQ+ and interracial couples to an inferior status in our nation. And, as we have seen all too often, the perception of a group of people as being inferior leads to hateful speech, discriminatory laws, and violence intended to intimidate and terrorize marginalized people and their communities.

“This long overdue law will prevent the stripping of rights and the upending of the lives of couples and families across the country by those who would seek to exclude certain people from the freedom to marry. Indeed, this freedom has long been recognized as a part of our fundamental right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness – a declaration made hundreds of years ago that remains core to our democracy.”
